

Families BIG READING Strategies to ASK...

Personal Connections:

What do you know about yourself and other stories that relate to this story? Tell me about...

Predicting Questions:

What clues share what this story is about - title, cover, blurb.

Visualising Pictures:

What pictures do you see in your mind when you hear or see...?

Questioning the Story:

Use what, who and where to gather information about the story and the author. Encourage self-questioning.

Checking for Meaning:

Make a guess about something you don't know using what you do know.

Clarify & Summarise:

Use what, who, when and where questions to retell and identify the main parts of the story. Who was your favourite character, and why?



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Suggestions: Use card / double-sided printing / Fit / Flip on long edge / Use the bottom image as a guide for cutting. Use velcro on front to change feeling circles to explore each feeling or make the front top higher and glue circles.



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
